



## **WHAT ARE GAME CARDS AND THERE IMPORTANCE**

Game Cards (Reports) serve as the official record of a game and are the source of reference for protests, appeals, complaints or other matters of Association responsibility.

Game Cards (Reports) must be submitted to referee by both the home and visiting team prior to start of the game.

The Game Card (Report) is the Association's verification of referee coverage. The Game Card (Report) must be completed by the home and visiting team coach and submitted to the referee for every game.

A valid Game Card (Report) must be signed by the home and visiting team coach and the referee.

Referee records the game scores and should list any official assistant referee.

Coaches are encouraged to complete referee evaluations for every game. An objective evaluation of the game's referee will benefit both CFBSA and the referee.

Coaches must verify that injuries are documented on Game Cards (Reports) immediately following the game.

Game Cards are also referred to Game Reports.

Complete Game Cards (Reports) must be submitted by both teams (U4-U10) within 48 hours of completion of game. Failure to submit Game Cards (Reports) within 48 hours may result in a penalty, included, however not limited to loss of points in team standings.
