

Coaches are required to have their Coaches ID Badge visibly displayed at each game. No more than 3 coaches allowed on the players side during a game. If any coach does not have his/her Coaches ID Badge displayed you must ask them to display their badge and it must be visible the entire game.

If a coach does not have his/her badge with them you will need to ask the coach for their North Texas Roster and a government issued picture ID, a drivers license will do. You must then compare the government issued ID with their N. Texas Roster. If the coaches name does not appear on the teams official N. Texas Roster then he/she is not allowed on the players side of the field during the game. You must record on the Game Report that coach did not have his/her Coaches ID Badge and was not allowed to coach from players sided. You must notify league officials.

If a coach does not have his/her badge, however their name appears on the teams official N. Texas Roster you will allow the coach to coach from the players side. You must record on Game Report that coach did not have his/her Coaches ID Badge; however his/her ID matched their official N. Texas Roster. You need to notify league officials.

Each coach must hand you the correct age appropriate Game Report before each game-no hand written forms will be accepted. If a coach does not have a Coaches Badge and does not have his/her official N. Texas Roster then you abandon the game and record it on the Game Report. If a coach does not have his/her badge, Game Report or N. Texas Report you must also abandon the game. Whenever you abandon a game you need to notify the Director of Referees and VP of Coaches and Referees within 48 hours of the game.

All coaches have been advised of the correct procedure and policy for ID Badges, Game Reports and their N. Texas Roster.
